A Message from Pastor Leigh



This year I chose to take a study leave after Thanksgiving to prepare for Advent. What I have most discovered is that this leave time has helped me to begin to prepare my own heart for this season. So, I offer you what's most on my heart this Advent and what is important for me to practice as I lean into the liminal space of holy waiting.

Cultivate Expectation: One walk into Target and you know exactly how many days you have left to find the perfect things to "make it Christmas" for your family, as if it was ours to make. So, during the busyness that often accompanies this time of year, we must create moments of stillness to anticipate the coming of our Savior. What are the promises of God and the hope found in Christ for you? I invite you to join me in spending as much time thinking about those questions as we do about what to buy or what to cook.

Engage in Advent Practices: Consider incorporating Advent traditions and practices into your daily life. This can be as simple as lighting candles on your own Advent wreath or spending dedicated time in Scripture each day. It could be bundling up for a winter walk each day and just asking God to prepare your heart for what's coming.

Seek the Light in Darkness: Advent reminds us that even in the darkest moments, the light of Christ shines. The news around us is especially hard these days and turning it off does not make you a bad world citizen. Seeking the presence of Christ during challenges, uncertainties and the complexity of this world is important. Do you trust his light dispels all darkness?

Extend Acts of Kindness: Embrace the spirit of giving, not just your physical gifts but the gift of your time. Who needs to be heard? Who needs a visit? Kindness and generosity of heart are at the heart of the gospel story. If you aren't "feeling the season" yet, practicing that kind of grace just might be what your heart needs.

You and I are four weeks away from the holiest of nights, the night we remember once again that God is with us, that Jesus came in person to show us what love really looks like and how we can really and truly love. I pray we each drink deeply from this time, preparing our hearts for the One who really is the Prince of Peace.

New Media Desk

Have you seen the new media desk? You'll find it in the northwest corner of the Sanctuary. It is locking and has enough room to store most of our equipment and provides enough outlets to plug in the many cords needed to power and connect this equipment for sharing our weekly service on Zoom. Before the arrival of the desk, we had to store the equipment in a secure but far-away part of the building. Almost 20 cords had to find the right connection each week, with some probability of a mismatch and disruption to programming. Now everything stays in place, and starting is as simple as turning on the power. This is a wonderful gift to our dedicated tech crew: Jim and Diana Lilje, Jacq Skeffington, Claudia Ross-Weston, and Jim Hyde; and consequently, to our whole congregation. The purchase of the desk was made possible by the memorial gift from Kate Smith.

Minutes of the monthly Session meetings are available upon request. Highlights from the November meeting include:

Session will present revised Terms of Call for Pastor Leigh in a Congregational meeting to be held December 10 following worship. Once the Congregation approves the pastor's Terms of Call, Session will finalize the 2024 budget. The congregation will also elect church officers whose terms will commence Jan 1, 2024.

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation and Corporation will be held January 28, 2024 following worship. During this meeting we will review the 2023 Annual Report and elect the 2024 Nominating Committee.

The Planning Committee is prioritizing security recommendations prepared by Matt Lilje of the Seattle Police Department. Much of the remodeling of the Narthex bathroom is completed.

Faith Formation

After having covered selections from <u>The Good Ancestor</u> by Roman Zrznaric, we will take a break and discuss lessons prepared specifically for Advent by Pastor Leigh, who explains, "I've created this year's Advent Faith Formation Study to look at and unpack Jesus as Messiah. Each of the four weeks will have a slightly different lens.

- Week One (Thursday, November 30) at 7pm on Zoom) is Anticipating the Messiah.
- Week Two (Tuesday, December 5 at 7pm on Zoom) is The Birth of the Messiah and Messianic Fulfillment.
- Week Three (Tuesday, December 12 at 7pm on Zoom) is Ministry of Jesus and Messianic Identity.
- Week Four (Thursday, December 21 at 7pm on Zoom will look at Jesus αs Risen Messiah.

Please note that two of the sessions are on Tuesday and two are on Thursday, because of scheduling issues.

I will email you a study guide two days before each session and encourage you to read through it and the scriptures in each one. We will then discuss them together in the hour we have each time.

I'm looking forward to being with you as we lean into Advent together."

Please join us in these faith-filled discussions. Everyone is welcome.

December 3 is Food Bank Sunday. There is always a need for staples such as spaghetti and other pastas, canned tuna fish, peanut butter, broth and personal hygiene items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste. We have also been alerted to special needs for the holidays. Please consider making a donation that includes items such as condiments, baking staples, boxed potatoes, cooking oil, cranberry and pumpkin sauce and "meals in a can" such as beef stew. There is also a need for pet food. For donations of bulk pet food, volunteers from VIPP will break down and repackage for individual distribution. You can bring items to the Sunday service, take them directly to the Food Bank or deliver them to the VPC office and we will follow up.

If you are thinking of an unusual Christmas gift for that special friend or relative, this is your opportunity. Donate an animal, fishing supplies, water purification system, refugee food basket etc. to be sent where our parent denomination has identified a need. Those who make gifts can request either e-cards or hard copy certificates to send to the person being gifted.

In January the Purposeful Service committee will request notebooks prepared by Vashon High School seniors for the Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation awards. Building and Grounds

We still need to install baseboards in the kitchen and hallways. We'll attempt starting it during December's Second Saturday work party on December 9. I'll set up stations inside or outside depending on the weather, and we'll cut and paint the boards before installing them. Please plan to join us at 10:00.

Pastor Leigh's office door still needs to be stained. The front door, library table, and Communion table still need to be sanded and stained, and the wooden fence separating VPC's front lawn from Zamorano's' dining area still needs to be replaced. If you are experienced in carpentry or in sanding and staining, please contact me and we will work out a plan for you to work at your leisure.

The worklist provided by King County Surface Water Management inspectors of our ground water containment systems was completed and submitted November 26. Compliance greatly reduces our land taxes.

All fire extinguishers, emergency exit lights, the sprinkler system and back-flow preventor were inspected in November and deemed satisfactory.

A new water fountain and bottle filling station will be installed in the Great Hall during Carpe Diem's Christmas break.
