### A Message from Pastor Leigh



Dear Ones of VPC,

Someone recently asked me how the date of Easter is determined. As I listened to myself answering the person, "It's based on a full moon date," I realized that felt a bit unexciting. Thinking about it later in the day, I remembered the reference to Easter as a "moveable feast."

It's the first Sunday after the first full moon after March 21, the Spring Equinox. That full moon is called the "Paschal Moon."

That might be more than you wanted to hear about Easter but the idea of a "moveable feast" has been sitting heavily in my heart as I think about it during the season of Lent. What is a moveable feast? It's a date that moves but what is a moveable feast in your heart? Does Easter move with you? Do you experience Easter moments throughout your life?

One thing I have been asking myself is what does it mean to LIVE the resurrection? Am I a resurrection person? Does my life reflect a belief in the resurrection daily not just on one Sunday after a full moon?

These are questions that I'd like to invite you to sit with as we finish these last weeks of Lent and prepare to proclaim our faith in a Risen Messiah. What does the resurrection mean to us in how we live and move and have our being individually and together?

Where is resurrection happening in your life? Where is it happening in our community? Where is it happening in our congregation? Does this moveable feast move with you? A professor in seminary used to say, with some frequency, "Resurrection is the realization that something has to die in order for something new to be born, for something new to be risen up."

Theologian and preacher Eugene Peterson wrote this, "It is not easy to convey a sense of wonder, let alone resurrection wonder, to another. It's the very nature of wonder to catch us off guard, to circumvent expectations and assumptions. Wonder can't be packaged, and it can't be worked up. It requires some sense of being there and some sense of engagement."

What do you think it means to convey the wonder of the resurrection? Do we allow ourselves to get lost in it, to simply dwell in it? To engage it, we must live it together. We must let this moveable feast move us, move with us and move in us.

My prayer for us this Easter season is to engage resurrection wonder, to get lost in it, to savor it and to allow the proclamation of a Risen Lord to change our daily lives, not just on one Sunday.

Easter is coming! Easter is also here. You and I are Easter people! May our lives show that Jesus is alive and at work always.

Minutes of the monthly Session meeting are available upon request. Highlights from the February meetings include:

#### Session Vision Retreat

A Session Vision retreat was held at Camp Sealth on February 9. The discussion centered on how the church could/should be positioned to anticipate and respond to community/congregation needs in the near and long-term future.

Session members also evaluated the current core teams and committee structures regarding their relevance and effectiveness in today's environment. Recognizing that the Purposeful Service and Outreach ministries intersect and sometimes overlap, it was agreed to combine these into one team entitled "Community Service." Session has restructured their 2024 meeting schedule to hold the traditional business meetings bi-monthly, with strategic discussions on how to advance our vision being the focus in the other months. Specific business/church matters needing attention will also be included in the vision meetings.

#### **Session Business Meeting**

Session met at VPC on February 13.

Lauretta Hyde, Jim "Trace" Hyde, and Marcy Rice were reinstated as members.

A Community Service motion was approved to allow the church building to be used as an overnight shelter during times of extreme cold. This is subject to the supervision of a certified non-profit organization with trained staff and volunteers.

#### Worship

This month includes our Lenten observations and celebrations. Join us on Zoom each Tuesday during Lent for a special Faith Formation discussion led by Leigh. On Wednesdays, also on Zoom, Leigh hosts a short, introspective Taizé service. On Maundy Thursday, March 28, VPC will host an ecumenical event that includes our neighbors the Lutherans, Episcopalians, and Methodists. This is a hybrid (Zoom and in-person) service which begins at 7:00 PM.

Good Friday will be another ecumenical service, also at 7:00 PM, at VPC and on Zoom.

Easter celebrations will begin with a Sunrise Service at 6:45 at Camp Burton around the outdoor firepit. Please plan to arrive by 6:30, and come prepared with a flashlight. (It is always darkest before the dawn.) We will hold our traditional Easter Sunday service at 10:00 in the Sanctuary, followed by traditional Easter treats and an Easter egg hunt for the kids. All are invited!

There are special flower displays in the Sanctuary during the Lenten Sunday services. **March 10** will be a Stone Bouquet. You're invited to bring flowers/greenery from your own garden to incorporate into a communal arrangement. To ensure your flowers are included in this bouquet, **please bring them to the church by 9:30 that morning**. **March 24** is Palm Sunday. Palms will be provided for the service. On **March 31**, **Easter Sunday**, flowers will be provided by the Worship Committee.

#### Purposeful Service and Outreach Committees Combined and Streamlined

The committee formerly known as Purposeful Service now has a new name: Community Service. With that change we have taken on additional responsibilities. At their February 9 retreat, the Session decided to combine the Outreach and Purposeful Service committees, recognizing that their missions and programs often overlap. The new committee will be responsible for organizing all VPC activities designed to reach people and groups beyond the VPC congregation. The Community Service team will not be doing all the work, however. As always, we will need volunteers from our congregation so that we can provide these programs to our neighbors (both local and beyond). You will be hearing from us!

#### Food Bank Sunday: March 3

March 3 is Food Bank Sunday. There is always a need for staples such as spaghetti and other pastas, canned tuna, peanut butter, broth and personal hygiene items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste. Also, please consider donating cooking supplies such as oil and boxed mixes. Bring your donated items to the Sunday service, take them directly to the Food Bank, or deliver them to the VPC office and we will follow up.

#### One Great Hour of Sharing

With Presbyterian churches (PCUSA) throughout the country, we are participating in the One Great Hour of Sharing collection. The collection is used in almost equal amounts for three PCUSA programs: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-development of People. OGHS is the only one of the four national offerings in which VPC participates. In the past our community has been very generous, and we hope to continue that. #### Community Service (Continued)

#### One Great Hour of Sharing

Lent began early this year – February 14. This period is when VPC, and Presbyterian churches (PCUSA) throughout the country, participate in the One Great Hour of Sharing collection. The collection is used for three PCUSA programs:

- \* Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (32%). These funds are designated for communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters.
- \* Presbyterian Hunger Program (36%). These funds are used to alleviate hunger and the systemic causes of poverty so that all may be fed.
- \* Self-development of People (32%). This program invests in communities responding to their experiences of racism, oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these social ills.

OGHS is the only one of the four national offerings in which VPC participates. In the past our community has been very generous, and we hope to continue that. Please mark checks or cash envelopes "OGHS" or use the dedicated on-line button on the VPC web page.

#### Groundskeeping


