Dear Ones of VPC,

As I am writing this, I am reflecting on the wonderful job you all did hosting so many visitors on Easter Sunday. One person said to me, "This was delightful; the congregation is so friendly." So often, as a pastor, I get to listen to the stories of how churches have wounded people. At VPC, there is definitely a sweet spirit in the air.

In this season of Eastertide, you might be asking, "Now what?" We stayed with the story of Jesus' life to the point of his death and resurrection. So, now what?

Over the next couple of months, as we look at the book of Acts, we'll be looking at that very question. What were the disciples called to do? What are we called to do today?

# Community Service Areas of Responsibility

#### Scholarships, Outreach to the Public, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

April 7 is Food Bank Sunday. There is always a need for staples such as spaghetti and other pastas, canned tuna, peanut butter, broth and personal hygiene items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste. Paper goods are also accepted, as are cooking supplies such as oil and boxed mixes. Bring items to the Sunday service, take them directly to the Food Bank or deliver them to the VPC office and we will follow up.

We will be accepting applications for the Heindsmann Scholarship in April. The scholarship was funded by a grant from long time VPC members Ted and Virginia Heindsmann, and will be awarded in May. The primary criterion for award of the scholarship is that it does not go to a graduating high school senior but rather to someone with more academic experience or a person seeking a new employment area. Thank you for your outstanding support of the annual One Great Hour of Sharing collection. At the time of this writing, OGH contributions totaled over \$3,300.

The VPC committee reviewing the notebooks submitted by Vashon High School seniors for the Vashon Presbyterian Church scholarship met on March 24. The committee will make a recommendation to Session and the Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation, and the award will be announced near graduation.

Pi Day, March 14 (3/14 = 3.14) was enjoyed by about 200 people eating pie at VPC. And many celebrated Liz Loveness's birthday with her at a table in the Narthex. Many VPCers were present to help. Sue Weston greeted people at the door, while Russ Dorr encouraged those walking by to join us. Héré Thieme and Kathy O'Laughlin cut pies and served people throughout the event. They were assisted by others during the day. Pastor Leigh brought games to familiarize people with many aspects of Pi, and Lindsay Hofman ran a contest for who could write the most decimal places for the number Pi from memory. The winner had 26 correct digits. Science and treats combined for a delightful afternoon! Many thanks to Lindsay Hofman, who organized the event, and to all who brought pies to make this possible.
