
A New Look for our Sanctuary

Dear Ones of VPC,

Madeleine L'Engle wrote, "Stories make us more alive, more human, more courageous, more loving." The power of story is not one to be underestimated. And if you want to share in a pot of tea, I welcome that as well. My prayer is that we continue to widen the margins of grace for each one of us and all those around us and do the good and holy work of God's beloved community.

Community Service Areas of Responsibility

Scholarships, Outreach to the Public, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

May 5 is Food Bank Sunday. The web page notes the continuing need for staples such as spaghetti and other pastas, canned tuna fish, peanut butter and broth. Personal hygiene items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste are always appreciated, as are cooking supplies such as oil and boxed mixes. Bring items to the Sunday service, take them directly to the Food Bank or deliver them to the VPC office and we will follow up. Given that the Food Bank is currently raising funds for a new building, it is especially important that the community generously provide food items rather than have them purchased.

The Community Service committee met on April 19 to discuss summer activities. The committee recommended to Session that the proceeds from the festival parking and chairs be donated to the Vashon-based Journeymen Institute and that the proceeds from the Yard Sale be donated to Vashon Youth and Family Services. Session approved those recommendations at the April 23 monthly business meeting.

We are looking for a volunteer to receive and keep a record of requests for parking and chairs on festival Saturday (July 20). Most requests will come via e-mail, so this can be done from home. Another volunteer will make reserved signs for the seats to be placed on the chairs Saturday morning. If you would like to do either of these, please contact me at rwspang@centurytel.net.
