Transition

What does the word transition conjure up in your mind? Does it bring excitement, anticipation or fear to mind? Do you gather a group of friends and talk about it or do you hunker down and rally the wagons in fear as if about to be attacked. Do you listen for the still small voice of the Holy Spirit. Do you pray, asking God to be with you in this time or try to tell Him how you think He should work this out (to your advantage of course).

Life is change. From the moment of conception we undergo changes. We grow, we respond to the changes surrounding us! We move out of the womb and learn to breathe. We learn to plan and think we can control situations and events, and to some extent we can. In fact, I believe we are called to be an integral part of God's creation. The essential element for us "God loving people" is to listen for that voice and respond with it in mind in each and every situation in which we find ourselves.

We at VPC are in transition. PC(USA) is in transition! It's not something that is just starting to happen. Session has been in discernment with the aid of teaching elders from Renewal Ministries Northwest since January of 2014. We have conducted an appreciative enquiry acknowledging that "change is coming" and had a couple of congregational conversations about what God is saying to us at this time and in this place.

Throughout the months of August and most of September we will fill the pulpit with guest speakers. I see this as a time to listen for that still small voice through the words of a number of different individuals. I hope that through the words of these diverse speakers we will be inspired to continue the conversation of where God is calling us to be, in unity with diversity.

I invite you to invite your friends, even your unchurched friends, to come with you and then engage them in a conversation about the experience in a way that does not expect conversion.

We are definitely vulnerable during transitions. How we respond in our vulnerable moments demonstrates who we are.

PC session met on July 13 for the scheduled monthly meeting. Vashon resident Nathan Sackett spoke about the Missional Community program in Tacoma, in which his family participated. Missional Communities are small groups of families geographically close to each other that care for and nurture each other, and seek to make disciples. Session discussed the program. In addition to the regular team reports, Brownie reported on the activity of the Transition Committee preparing for the search for an interim pastor. Session approved, with modification, the team's proposed interim pastor position description and the church description to be made available to applicants. Barb explained the Personnel Committee's concern that the part-time position be structured such that the incumbent does not end up devoting more than the contracted time. Session also called a congregational meeting on July 26 for congregational concurrence in ending the pastoral relationship with Dan. Finally, session approved Leona Moon Coldeen as Safe Conduct policy administrator, agreed that occasional VPC drivers need not submit to background checks, and appointed Brownie as alternate commissioner to the July 21 Seattle Presbytery meeting.
