Building and Grounds Maintenance

The Carpe Diem teachers and parents are planning a work party to trim shrubs around the south parking area. I'll forward a date via eNews when decided. This will be a fun way to connect with some of these new children and their parents.

<u>**Toolbelts**</u> Our "Toolbelts" group continues to meet on Tuesday mornings 10:00am-noon. 3-4 men usually attend and we gladly invite anyone else to join us. We have converted the Nursery storage room into an office and storage space. We check sump pumps, put new filters in furnaces, change light bulb and other fun "home repair and maintenance" activities! Toolbelts next project will be cleaning the rain gutters next Tuesday morning. Bring your favorite ladder if you'd like to help out!

Carpe Diem Primary School began classes on Sept 9th. We monitored traffic in the parking lot at drop off and pick up times during the first three days with no incidents and lots of smiling faces. The children, parents and teachers are all extremely happy with the space and grateful for our partnership. The Harbor School's "big picture" of our partnership is that they hope to consolidate in one campus eventually and anticipates they will need our space for approximately 3 years while planning and fundraising. We were able to store Carpe Diem's tables and chairs in the classrooms allowing us to set up 10 tables for Dan Houston's reception and keep the Great Hall open for mingling prior to dinner. We're confident we can continue to do that as necessary to make the Social Hall available for large events. Many of the comments I've heard have been positive about brightening up the halls and classrooms. Please let me know of any concerns you have.

Building Use We were sorry to hear of the decision of the Quilters Guild to cease having their monthly meetings at VPC. The Guild held their regular monthly meeting Tuesday Sept 15th and Carpe Diem vacated the Social Hall about 9:30 allowing us to set up the usual 8 tables for their 10am-2pm meeting. We tried to reassure them that they were valued friends of VPC and how we and the school would be able to better accommodate them in the future. Many of the members commented on how much they liked the new life in artwork and children's voices in the hall but the board of directors decided that in the future they would meet at Bethel church.

Carpet Cleaning The IFCH covered the cost (\$397.25) of cleaning the carpet in the Social Hall and Great Hall Friday, August 14th. The cleaner, Robin Lewis, recommended we have the carpets cleaned every 6 months. I discussed sharing the cost of cleaning every 6 months with the Head of School at Carpe Diem and Emma Amiad of the IFCH and both groups are willing to share the cost again. The IFCH meal coordinator, Harmon Arroyo and some of those enjoying the meals put up 5 tables with 6 chairs at each table every Tuesday and Thursday evening and return them to the storage closet at the end of each meal. This is adequate for the number of meals presently served.

Office Staff We are seeking another "Office Volunteer" to answer phones and direct concerns to appropriate Mission Team Leaders. Volunteers staff the church office Monday through Thursday from 10-2. If you are interested in helping in this ministry once or twice a week, drop by the church during office hours and talk to the volunteer on duty. It's a great way to find out about the life of VPC beyond Sunday mornings.

Clerk's Corner – October

Session held its monthly meeting on September 20, with Associate Executive Presbyter Eliana Maxim moderating. Most team reports were provided in written form before the meeting. Discussion as to worship focused on the need for pulpit supply in October, before the interim pastor starts, and the need to hold the October session meeting on the 18th. Jacq led a discussion about Carpe Diem's use of the building and the coordination that has taken place to assure a smooth transition. He also suggested that session review the approval process for outside use of the sanctuary, and it was agreed that use of the sanctuary by outside groups for a one-time use requires the informal unanimous agreement of session members. Session approved Creative Preschool's use of the basement for the forthcoming year at the same terms as for the previous year. Finally, session approved calling Rev. Lynn Longfield as interim pastor on the terms recommended by the Transition Team.
