VPC Newsletter Survey

In an attempt to improve church communications we have been surveying members about the VPC newsletter delivery system and its place in the functioning of the church. In some ways the newsletter communication has been conducted in a 'one way' direction. Getting participation of the congregation should be a future goal. Think about the following survey questions. On Seeking Sanctuary

The opening line of the new Mission Statement the officers of the church are formulating states:

"Vashon Presbyterian Church exists to offer sacred sanctuary for all people yearning to draw close to God".

The emphasis on "sanctuary" came out of a process of scripture study and discernment the church undertook over the past 2-3 years.

Since I learned of this focus I have been thinking and praying about the concept of sanctuary and what it means to seek, be, and offer sanctuary in the midst of our ministry here at Vashon Presbyterian.

By the grace of God, in the process of preparing to lead a women's retreat for my neighborhood church at the end of April, I came across a marvelous book entitled "Finding Sanctuary" by Abbot Christopher Jamison of the Worth Monastery in England. In his book the Benedictine Abbot explores the disciplines, attitudes, and behaviors that lead us to become a living sanctuary in the midst of a troubled world -- spiritual disciplines like contemplation, obedience, humility, and building a community of hope. He speaks of experiencing sanctuary as not really about finding refuge from the world around us, but rather living the kind of focused and spiritually disciplined life that witnesses to the peace and power of God. In experiencing the sanctuary of God ourselves, we become active advocates for God's compassion and justice in a world of turmoil.

I look forward to us discovering more and more how to put "flesh" on our desire to offer sacred sanctuary.

Clerk's Corner

VPC session met on March 9, 2016 with two members absent. Teams and committees submitted written reports prior to the meeting; little discussion ensued although session approved steps underway for renewal of the Carpe Diem contract. Session continued discussion of a mission statement and narrative, and received the most recent draft for further discussion at a future retreat. Session also reviewed the Personnel Committee's recommendations regarding changes to the Safe Conduct Policy, and deferred all but one change (regarding contact with the media) until the April meeting. Session approved hiring a nursery attendant for two hours on Sunday mornings; that person would work with a VPC volunteer. Discussion centered on what the expectations of the person are in the event that there are no children to watch. Finally, session reviewed with Lynn the log of hours that she spends on her VPC pastorate, and discussed ways to ensure that she does not have to work more hours than the contract specifies.

NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS/FAMILIES SERVED WITH IFCH FUNDS IN 2015

In a recent newsletter article, information was given about how many meals IFCH serves. Here is additional information about how IFCH distributes services/funds (not taken from IFCH budget, but other sources such as other agencies, volunteers, churches). In 2015 IFCH helped (other than the meals) 124 individuals and 52 families (ranging from 2-5 persons).

Some of the funding was procured from other agencies you will note, but the work of procuring those funds is a tribute to the hard work of IFCH board members.

Showers 240 **Firewood** 14

Temporary housing 13 individuals and one family of 4 persons

Salvation Army vouchers 72 vouchers (1-4 people served) per voucher \$250 each month = \$3000 value for 2015

Rent 48 individuals and families
