## Lent Begins March 1<sup>st</sup>

### Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days of the year for Christians. It takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday. Born out of the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting, Ash Wednesday includes the wearing of ashes on one's forehead or hand. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As a priest or pastor applies the

ashes to a person's forehead, in a declaration that we are all mortal, he/she speaks the words:

## *"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."*

Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case our grief that we have separated ourselves from God.

The mark of the ashes serves as a sign to ourselves and others that we acknowledge our mortality and prayerfully seek a closer relationship with God.

Liz's email reminder to get my newsletter article written came through just as I was finishing up preparations for our Ash Wednesday services. The "Facing Mortality, Embracing Life" sign for the public imposition of ashes event is in the car, ashes sealed nicely in my black Ash Wednesday ceramic pot, handouts printed, evening readings and prayers lined out, Lenten stole folded and placed near the door so I don't forget it. I even have the first draft of the bulletin for the First Sunday in Lent completed.

But am I truly ready for Lent? Am I ready to face my own mortality? Is my own heart prepared to honestly examine deeply my own spiritual life, my commitment to God, my failings, my passions, my hopes? Am I ready to quiet my soul, to listen to the Spirit, to walk with Vesus toward Jerusalem and all that entails, to face the suffering of God, to hear again the good news of God's never failing love for me, to open myself to the possibility, again, of resurrection. Am I? While I walked through the silence of Wright Park in the early hours of the morning a day ago, aware that birds had returned to the trees to sing their greeting of the dawn, I contemplated the fact that had I not left newspaper, TV, and phone behind I likely would not have noticed this subtle sign of spring's promise. Quiet – I feel drawn to stillness this year more than ever. Perhaps because of the incessant cacophony of voices inundating our public lives of late. "Now is the time", the Spirit seemed to say to me, "for stillness". It is time now for all of us to quiet our souls and attend to the journey of Lent. Early Christians observed "a season of penitence and fasting" in preparation for celebrating the resurrection of Jesus at Easter. Lent, from an Old English word meaning "spring" has a long history. In the Western church the forty days of Lent extend from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday, omitting Sundays.

This year my Lenten Discipline will be to responsibly but none-the-less severely limit my "in-take" of screens, news outlets, Facebook, texts and emails. My Lenten Discipline will be to let go of responding internally to the strident voices around me, in favor of listening with more intention to the quiet voice of God speaking to my soul. What will your discipline be?

When the weather allows, we'll <u>resume painting</u> the railing around the wheelchair ramp but will have to wait some time for the yard to dry out and weather warm up before allowing the painters to bring in a lift to finish the front of the church and bell tower. We did have the <u>carpets cleaned</u> last Friday. Carpe Diem and the IFCH chipped in to split the cost with us. Next we plan to paint the French Doors leading to the Great Hall.

We met with <u>Carpe Diem's</u> Head of School and administrative assistant early in February to review expenses and plan for next year. They are very happy with our present partnership and plan to continue renting our spaces again next year. We offered them another 1 yr contract at the same terms as our present agreement and are awaiting a response from their Board of Directors. We plan to meet with the <u>Creative Preschool's</u> Board this month for the same discussion.

Let's plan on a <u>work party Saturday, March 18th</u> from 9-12. We can trim shrubbery, clean up and weed flower beds and give the grounds a general sprucing up. If the weather is inclement we can do general spring cleaning in the sanctuary, kitchen and closets. In the meantime, feel free to stop by the church at your convenience and pick up litter around the parking lot. Recyclables and trash can be placed in the receptacles within the fenced collection area in the parking lot. Trash goes in the dumpster and recyclable material in the plastic containers. Every little bit helps.

We will meet again on Tuesday, March 21 at noon in the library and invite all interested to attend (feel free to bring your lunch). In these times when we might be feeling like we need some "light", this is a place to receive it.
