Thoughts from Leigh...

Dear Ones of Vashon,

As I am writing this, the sunshine is breaking through my office windows and I'm watching the folks from one of the AA groups leaving from their meeting. The grace with which you make this church open to the community is powerful and I am in awe of your kindness.

It's hard to believe it's already July and I have been with you as pastor for two months now. In some ways, it feels like yesterday that I met with the PNC and, in other ways, it feels like I've been here for a longer time. I suspect the latter feeling is because of the graciousness with which you have received me, how natural it feels to be among you and how very much I feel called to be here. What I know is that I am very at peace, very at home and very glad to be a part of this congregation.

We've had a first brunch, gone through an installation, including planting a tree, and started hearing each other's stories. You've leaned into worship with a new pastor, who naturally made subtle changes. I am told our hand holding at the end is reclaiming of one of your earlier traditions. You've welcomed me to meals, coffee and into your homes and you continue to do so. I've met with Deacons and the Session and learned that both groups are both sensitive to the ferry schedule and will send me off to make it on time. These are some of the many ways that you have said and continue to say welcome to me.

When I was a little girl, the church was a place where I knew I was safe, where I could run and play on Saturdays while work parties and meal preparation kept my parents busy. I knew that everyone there cared about me and that they were mindful of me. They were my family and I knew I mattered to them. This is a model I've held in my heart my whole life because of that time. Church should be safe. Church should be mindful and church should be a place where we can run and play and enjoy the fellowship of others. Church should be family and everyone should know that they matter. This is what I have found among you...the safe space you work to hold for one another, the welcoming spirit and the mindful care of paying attention and I'm grateful to see you be the church.

My prayer for us as we continue through this summer is that we continue to pay attention, to welcome, to hold safe space and to see the Image of God in one another. As we work through this sermon series on Ephesians, I hope we can allow ourselves to be made alive in Him once again. "...You are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone." Ephesians 2:19-20 (NRSV)

What's on Your Mind?

Interfaith Brainstormers Meeting Notes 6/20/17

Present: Bob Ellis, Kathy Olsen, Koshin Chris Cain, Erin Durrett, Carol Spangler, Brownie Carver, Jacq Skeffington, Odie Hendershot, Paul Mitchell, Beverly Skeffington, Lorna Cunningham Beverly opened with prayer.

Eric Pryne, Food Bank Director and Kevin Jones from Backbone have asked members of the faith communities to continue support of their projects over the summer months. Eric is making presentations at various services. Jacq: VPC provides a Life-Changing Prayer service at Vashon Community Care Wednesday afternoons at 1:30. Anyone interested is invited to visit, join, and/or assist in the leadership of this weekly event. There was some discussion about whether this could become an interfaith project and it was noted that most of the participants, some of whom can't speak but can join in hymns through some hidden memory, have a Christian background. Koshin suggested that a meditation group might be appropriate at VCCC and Lorna, who coordinates the Wednesday afternoon teas at VCC, said that it could be included as a special activity.

An interdenominational Vacation Bible School will be hosted by St. John Vianney this year August 14-18 for children ages 4 to 12. Volunteers are needed to provide refreshments.

VPC will again this year offer Strawberry Festival parking and folding chairs for viewing the parade. Donations will be received to benefit the Vashon Resettlement Committee. Reservations are required and the parking slots/chairs sell out very quickly.

Carol: Followed up on the Kevin Jones (Backbone) call for social action from the faith community at the last Brainstormers meeting. Many of us are overwhelmed by the needs for action and involvement and Carol suggested that the place of the faith community is provide support and a sanctuary of the spirit to give the individual the strength to pursue his or her call to action, or to be able to understand that he or she can't do it all. She quoted from Parker Palmer's book, Healing the Heart of Democracy: The Courage to Create a Politics Worth of the Human Spirit: "You can only reach out as far as you are willing to reach in." Another recommended book is Karen Armstrong's Twelve Steps to A Compassionate Life.

Erin: The Methodist and Episcopalian churches are discussing the possibility of having community services for those who are feeling devastated and/or need strength to avoid burnout. Koshin suggested that more people would be drawn to this healing if there was outreach beyond the faith community as the search for social justice is both religious and secular. The "non-churched" might be more drawn to community spirituality as a whole if it were presented as more overtly inclusive. Odie reminded us that God is love and love is not confined. Erin reminded us that it is a spiritual undertaking to gather in ways that serve social justice.

Erin: Last Saturday, Erin was invested as a novice in the Order of Tiep Hien of the Lotus Institute and given the name "Joyful Dance of the Heart". On Sunday she was baptized In the Episcopal Church. She hopes that her dual commitment to both Buddhist and Christian practice will make her a more healing presence in the world—but, she commented, she can't do it all.

Lorna: As a visitor to Seattle Unity Church, Lorna was impressed by the fact that it included altars for all religions and suggested that an interfaith church be established on Vashon. Youth today are seekers of enlightenment and it is important that churches and other religious establishments are made relevant to the new generation. Jacq: with the present realities mainstream churches are facing, we need to be open to options. Erin: We are in a good space to be evolving spiritually, but it is important to come together not just for the cause, but for joy, which our children can observe and then build on it. Odie: Young people don't respond to traditional ways of worship; they need to praise God in a way that fills them with joy.

Bob: We reach into our community with a coded language. We need a different language that changes the way we talk about God.

Beverly closed the meeting with prayer. Next meeting is July 18.
