Thoughts from Leigh....

Dear Ones of Vashon,

"I smell chili and cornbread. Must mean football." Those are words that my family have all said on Saturdays for most of their lives. In our house, Saturdays in the fall mean homemade chili on the stove, cornbread in the oven and football on the television. The combination of these things also says home to them, and means mom is home.

Ritual is an important part of how we do life together as human beings. Individuals have rituals, families have rituals, churches and many other organizations all make meaning together through ritual. A good friend of mine shared that he always sweeps the porch when he first gets to what was once his parents' home. In this way, he is not only caring for this home but honoring something that has been passed to him in his family, something entrusted to him to be a steward.

I've been thinking about the rituals of church, ones that are common from church to church and ones that are part of individual congregations. I've been here just long enough to see them at work in the life of this church too. Jacq ringing the bell on Sunday mornings, a faithful group of ladies gathering for breakfast each week, volunteers who faithfully get the mail and answer the phone, the all church yard sale, and many other things.

We engage in ritual each Sunday as part of our worship, we gather and prayer and sing, we drink coffee and catch up, we exchange conversation that is unique to us while paying attention to who might be new. We honor ritual but we aren't confined by it, there is always room for new ideas and new people.

Rituals, at their best, tether us to one another and to those that have gone before us. Just like my friend who sweeps his porch, they bring a sense of oneness with those we hold dear. Rituals, at their worst, become exclusive. Holding up our rituals and asking, "Does this give us life?" is an important question for all people, churches included.

I see life giving ritual taking place in our congregation. I cherish the ways in which you make meaning of this life we share together, this family we create with one another. And I am grateful for how beautifully you make space for others who join us.

The greatest ritual we observe as a church is to love. We are tethered to Jesus when we love like he taught us to love. People who know my family closely know that on Saturdays in the fall, we have chili, for us and anyone who stops by. And in the same way, let the people in our community know that we are a church who loves and we always have more than enough for anyone who stops by.

Clerk's Corner

Session held its monthly meeting on August 7, with all members attending. Jacq reported that the annual audit was conducted on July 17, and he provided a written report with the audit team's findings and recommendations. The financial records were found to be in order. In view of a large donation in memory of Shirley Blake, session discussed the status of the Memorial Fund and committee. Diana agreed to revive the committee and bring to session recommendations for use of the funds. Session adopted a policy for dealing with deaths of members and friends, and how to coordinate with the funeral home. Session also discussed the need for people to prepare documents concerning their last wishes. Jacq noted that he is a trained facilitator of the workshops sponsored by Honoring Choices Vashon, which educates people as to the need to prepare documents relating to death and discuss their wishes with their families. Jacq offered to conduct a workshop at VPC on September 30. Leigh and Brownie led a discussion as to the content and format of the worship service. Session agreed upon several changes, in light of expressed preferences. Session voted to approve a joint worship service with the Methodist Church on World Communion Sunday, October 1; Leigh will preach. Finally, Jacq reported on the July Presbytery meeting, which he and other members attended.
