Preparing to Resume Indoor Worship

As mask and gathering restrictions are being lessened and/or lifted, preparations are underway at VPC to not only bring back indoor worship, but to expand and enhance the experience for everyone.

"Zooming" has provided us the opportunity to share our worship experience with those across the country. Worship service attendance via Zoom is routinely higher than when we worship solely in person. Offering a Zoom worship option in the sanctuary therefore is a priority.

We are in the process of ordering the technology equipment (webcams, screen, etc.) to set up an integrated inperson/Zoom worship experience. We have already upgraded our internet capability for this purpose. Stay tuned and stay patient—we WILL be worshiping together soon!

Dear Ones of VPC,

As we have been reading the words of the prophet Jeremiah, I am struck by how God's message was to live life right where you are. In the midst of exile, keep living, keep your part of the covenant, to love God and love one another. And that's exactly what has been happening during our season of exile known as Covid-19.

I've watched as you logged in to worship right where you were each week. I've listened to the stories of calls made to check on others. I watched as you matched the Presbytery's grant for IFCH to care for the community around you. This the kind of life that God asks us to live even in exile.

As we begin to gather in person socially, in small groups and eventually back in Sunday morning worship, I wonder what lessons of exile we will bring with us. What have we learned about God, about one another and about our presence in the community? What is God saying to us today as we return to the land we had to leave for a time?

One person shared that they felt a closeness to the congregation in ways they hadn't before because of the sharing experienced in small group settings on Zoom. How do we bring that back from the exile with us? Others have shared how grateful they have been for the variety of music we have experienced. What have you experienced and felt?

There will be an opportunity to share your thoughts and feelings from this season at an upcoming afternoon gathering at Jan and Nancy van Roessel's home. We are relocating our July 11th (2-4 pm) gathering to their outdoor pavilion where we can be sure to stay a bit cooler in the shade. We'll sing and pray together and be in small and large group discussions about all of these things as well as where we hope VPC is in 100 years.

What do you hear God saying? And what do WE hear God saying? This feels like a good time to talk about just that and I look forward to the conversation.

Clerk's Corner

Session held its regular monthly meeting June 16 via Zoom. Pastor Leigh opened the meeting with prayer.

Mission Resources Elder, Jim Lilje, presented the Income and Expense report through May 2021 and cash on hand as of May 31. Donations were slightly below anticipated for May but still above anticipated year-to-date. Expenses remain lower than budgeted, and mission partner donations continue as scheduled. Carpe Diem and Creative Preschool have both agreed to renew their leases for next year.

The Purposeful Service Committee will continue plans for a picnic/worship with Mary's Place, at Ober Park, in early September and will invite other churches to help with the event. They will also ramp up recycling efforts through information this summer. Faith Formation Elder Elizabeth Loveness has begun a series about the faith journeys of young adults. Free for All Zoom gatherings will move to 6:30 on Mondays evenings with a new topic, "Travels in the Holy Land." Outreach Elder Barb Huff reported that we will resume First Friday with S'mores on July 2nd. Worship Elder Al Ross-Weston reported that a worship service will be held outdoors at the Ross-Weston's home in the afternoon of July 11. After Talk will begin meeting at the church on Mondays. While the sanctuary and other meeting rooms may be used for small group meetings, to avoid scheduling conflicts, their use must be reserved through the building use coordinator.

Session's next scheduled meeting will be July 20th at 4:30 pm at the home of Elizabeth Loveness.

Purposeful Service Team News Areas of Responsibility

Scholarships, Mary's Place partnership, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

In partnership with the Methodist church and the Park District, we are planning a worship service and picnic lunch with Mary's Place in late August or early September. Beverly Skeffington is the point person on this. More information will be provided in the August News and Concerns.

Brownie Carver reports that Island workers who lost employment due to the pandemic are doing better. IFCH helped 19 families with rent and seven with utilities in June. Each month the number has been decreasing since the beginning of Spring. Last June we were assisting 27 families. The most that were given assistance was 37 this past March. Although the donations are decreasing, the need seems to be going down for virus rent.

One of our Mission Partners is Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, a program of our parent denomination. PDA is to committed immediate and long-term response to natural and human-caused disasters, and humanitarian response to refugees and asylum seekers. In 2020 PDA made 476 grants, providing \$6.5 million in 47 states and 56 countries, including \$3.5 for COVID-19 assistance. PDA also provides resources to educate and guide congregations, and deploys National Response Team members. This year we sent \$1,000 from the VPC general fund to PDA for this important ministry, in addition to a portion of our One Great Hour of Sharing collection that went to PDA.

In August we will hold another collection of styrofoam and plastic materials not accepted at the county transfer station. **There will not be a July collection because of the holiday**. We still collect IGA and Thriftway receipts for reimbursement and donation of the funds; please be sure to write your name and telephone number on each receipt, and put them in the prayer box facing the highway. The first Sunday is still Food Bank Sunday. Please consider a donation at one of our supermarkets.

Reflections from The Pretty Place



The Fred W. Symmes Chapel, aptly known as "Pretty Place," is part of YMCA Camp Greenville. Set on the eastern ridge of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Camp Greenville is the fifth largest "Y" in the nation and has been in operation over 100 years. The chapel provides breathtaking panoramic views of the South Carolina upstate area and is highly sought after for weddings.

Last month my two brothers and I, as part of a 10-day roadtrip through the Carolinas, visited Pretty Place to take in the views. Sadly, it was a foggy day and the best we got were glimpses of greenery through moving clouds. But equally inspirational were the many plaques posted on timbers, with verses or dedications in honor of past YMCA campers and leaders. We noted the many that were dedicated to young men who had perished in World War II. Some of the messages were poignant. Here's a one that spoke to me. I hope it resonates with you as well.

"O thou Divine Spirit that, in all events of life, art knocking at the door of my heart, help me to respond to Thee. I would not be driven blindly as the stars over their courses. I would not be made to work out Thy law unintelligently, to obey Thy mandates unsympathetically. I would take the events of my life as good and perfect gifts from Thee; I would receive even the sorrows of life as disguised gifts from Thee. I would have my heart open at all times to receive—at morning, noon, and night; in spring, and summer, and winter. Whether Thou comest to me in sunshine or in rain, I would take Thee into my heart joyfully. Thou art Thyself more than the sunshine; Thou art Thyself compensation for the rain; it is Thee and not thy gifts I crave. Knock, and I shall open unto Thee. Amen." George Matheson
