A Message from Pastor Leigh

Dear Ones of VPC,

As I write this to you, I am in my last few days of a "staycation." Nothing about this week went according to plan. It was just too hot to accomplish the list of tasks I had planned out. Early on I had to switch gears. I am lucky to have an air-conditioned home, so I went to work on a few inside projects, but I mostly read, rested, and made nutritious meals for myself and it was just what I needed. The spirit has been willing, but the body was tired. I needed sabbath.

Author Wayne Mueller writes, "Sabbath requires surrender. If we only stop when we are finished with all our work, we will never stop, because our work is never completely done. With every accomplishment there arises a new responsibility... Sabbath dissolves the artificial urgency of our days, because it liberates us from the need to be finished."

His book, <u>Sabbath</u>, is a favorite of mine. Sabbath "liberates us from the need to be finished." Isn't that an interesting statement? Human beings naturally resist the finishing of our physical lives. We work hard to put it off; in fact, yet we work hard to "finish" our work all the time. When we "finish" this work of being human is only known to God and in the meantime, God offers us sabbath. It's core to our health as God's people.

Someone recently told me that they needed to back off a bit of the work they were doing at the church. They expressed feeling a bit burned out by how there is always something more. As a similarly driven person myself, I said to this person, "It's okay to back up, it's actually good to back up and to enjoy some God given and God ordained sabbath rest."

You and I will not finish the work. In time, we will hand the work off to others and they won't finish it either. This work of being the church is ongoing. I don't say that to overwhelm you but to remind you that get to enjoy sabbath, too. If you are tired, rest. If you are frustrated, rest. If you feel like it never ends, rest. God rested. God invites us to rest. Part of being the church together is making the space to rest and to allow others the space to do the same. It's critical to loving one another and being an intentional community together.

You matter. You have sacred worth. You are a child of the Holy. And you get to rest when you need it. As we move through the rest of this summer and into the fall, I encourage you to take the space you need and speak your truth when you need it. I care about you and I'm here and I am reminded once again that I only CAN be because I experience sabbath.


Worship

Session held its regular monthly meeting July 19th via Zoom. Pastor Leigh planned to take vacation from July 25 – July 31. Reverend Dr. Bruce Baker filled the pulpit on July 31st. Any requests for Pastoral care during that period were to be made via Elder Barb Huff.

The treasurer reported a donation of \$60,000 was received from Kate Smith's brother following the sale of her house. Liz Loveness, Barb Huff, and Diana Lilje will form a committee to disburse the unrestricted funds. Two new pan, tilt, zoom cameras have been purchased and installed to enhance Zoom broadcasting out of funds previously approved by Session.

Vashon Opera and Vashon Chorale have both expressed interest in rehearsing in the sanctuary.

Since fundraising during the Strawberry Festival parade was cancelled, Barb Huff moved and Session approved donating proceeds from the August Yard Sale to Vashon Youth and Family Services and The DOVE Project, split 50/50.

Faith Formation

A number of people started reading the book <u>The One Year Through the Bible Devotional</u> at the beginning to year. There is a suggested reading and short discussion for each day of the year. Readers have been faithfully following the old testament and will start the new testament in early September. Kathryn O'Laughlin is one of these readers and writes the following:

"The One Year Through the Bible study group meets every other Monday at 7:00 PM on Zoom. We reflect on what we have learned from our daily readings that follow the book's progression through the Bible. These are lively discussions that look at the passages from historical and current perspectives. The old stories of the Patriarchs come alive with new understanding of God's care for His people, and David's relationship with God makes him a person to admire. My favorite book, so far is Proverbs. Words of wisdom that inspire 'AHA' moments. We are now in Isaiah, so join us. You will find the Bible a book of God's love, hope, and nourishing truth."

<u>The Following the Call</u> study group will restart in September. For those unfamiliar with the book, <u>Following the Call</u> brings together "prophetic voices from every era and a range of traditions to consider the repercussions of the words of The Sermon on the Mount." Essays by Leo Tolstoy, Martin Luther King Jr, E. Stanley Jones, Mother Teresa, Thomas Merton, Wendell Berry, Soren Kierkegaard are included among many others. Building and Grounds

The Second Saturday work party on July g^{th} was cancelled. However, Pastor Leigh, Thomas Abraham, Kathy O'Laughlin and Aldo Flores showed up for an impromptu work party on July g^{th} in preparation for the Strawberry Festival. They did a wonderful job, and the grounds were prepared for lawn games and activities. We also plan to remove the sandbox in the play yard since it has fallen into disrepair, and we will start maintaining the flower bed along the walkway behind the sanctuary. It's an excellent spot for gardening if you are interested. Session approved contracting with Aldo Flores and his crew to keep up with the lawn care. Liz Loveness will monitor their work.

A group of four youths, Pastor Leigh and I painted the new youth room on July 21st. It was a fun-filled afternoon, with most of the paint ending up on the ceiling and walls! A few other volunteers showed up on the following Saturday to touch up the few missed spots. I have heard many favorable comments about how bright and inviting the room has become. Drop in to check it out next time you are in church.

New video cameras for broadcasting via Zoom were purchased and installed. A camera mounted near the piano now offers the option of viewing the faces of those attending worship in the sanctuary while being operated remotely.

Carpe Diem has had timbers installed around the gravel area where their large play structure is located. They have also planned to upgrade or replace that structure and make other improvements to the south end of the parking lot before classes resume. Carpe Diem also plans to repaint the hallways in the new building in August.

The Vashon Healthcare District has resumed in person community meetings in the Social Hall on the first and third Wednesdays of each month from 6:00-8:00 PM. Vashon Opera will resume rehearsals in the sanctuary in mid-August, and the Vashon Chorale will resume rehearsals there in September.

Qualifications Required? NO previous experience needed. Handicaps for those who can't hear, see, hit the ball less than 5% of the time, or don't know how to score a game.


Rules? Singles, best 2 of 3 short games (15pts). Double elimination tournament (so you are guaranteed 2 appearances)
