A Message from Pastor Leigh

Dear Ones of VPC,

Clerk's Corner

Session held its regular monthly meeting September 20th via Zoom due to air quality issues. Jim Lilje offered a reading by Henri Nouwen from <u>Bread for Life</u>.

Pastor Leigh would like Session to develop a forward-looking plan around increasing outreach to people on the periphery, noting the impact of our reader board and our hybrid capabilities for gathering. Lindsay Hofman will also look for Faith Formation topics that may be of interest to this periphery community. Theology Pub would also benefit from additional advertisement to the community.

Since Christmas will fall on a Sunday this year, Session will plan on accentuating Christmas Eve service in person and plans on a Zoom- only service on Christmas Day.

The treasurer reported donations are now at almost 100% of budgeted income, and we are in a stable financial position. The church has also received another large donation from Kate Smith's family. Website and continued technological and sanctuary improvements are investment priorities in the short term. Session received a preliminary budget worksheet for 2023 and will refine it during the next two months.

Co-Op Preschool now holds a toddlers and infants (and parents) class Wednesdays from 9am – 2pm in the East room. The children are adorable, but please try to refrain from passing through the East Room on Wednesdays unless essential. Pastor Leigh will be happy to meet for pastoral visits around Vashon that day. Please call in advance to arrange a meeting or visit.

A Harvest Dinner planned for October 22nd at VPC was rescheduled for October 15th.

A local artists' Christmas Bazaar will be hosted December 3rd and 4th at VPC.

More details of all mission activities are listed in each committee's section of this newsletter.

Building and Grounds

The Second Saturday work party on September 10th trimmed shrubbery by the ramp and parking area, cleaned trash around the parking lot and north settling pond. On Saturday September 17th another party trimmed shrubbery and cleared the boardwalk in front of Sue Weston's Sylvan Beach home. Work parties are again planned for 10:00 AM—noon on October 1st at Sue's and October 8th at VPC. Please bring clippers and rakes and a pickup truck if you have one.

A removable handrail was installed in the middle of the concrete steps approaching the west entrance. The design allows the railing to be bolted directly into the concrete steps such that when removed there will be no raised tripping hazard.

Aldo Flores continues routine lawn care. His group also removed a couple of large sagging branches of the plum tree extending over the fence between the courtyard playground and Zamorana's restaurant. As the weather begins to cool, we intend to revitalize the flower beds behind the sanctuary and courtyard. Nancy van Roessel will lead this effort.

Worship in Many Forms

I've been thinking about different ways we worship. Most theologians divide worship into two major categories: <u>Corporate</u> or worshiping in a group of like-minded followers and <u>Personal</u> worship, where we either plan our own time for a devotional or when we acknowledge an isolated event or setting for which you recognize God's creation and express thanks and wonderment for the gift you've been given. An example of the former would be our Sunday morning service. These times usually carry meaning in the traditions, hymns and established but meaningful rituals for those included in corporate worship.

An experience on a hike at sunrise where nature hurls its grandeur into the orange-pink, day-break sky - has more emotional, and certainly personal, meaning for an individual. If they spontaneously stop and praise and thank God for this, they are certainly participating in personal worship. A more consistent form of personal worship is the daily devotional.

Some of us find being on walks, working in our gardens, hiking in the mountains, generally being away from others - encourages personal worship. It's interesting to me that so many seek separation from other people to find God. Nature seems absolutely to be God's creation. All too often when people are surrounded by other people and "people created" things ie the Rivian, art, or beautiful piece of music we forget Who's at the center of the Universe. Well, with these thoughts as background, I am preparing a survey, which will be available this month, for our congregation on avenues that would grow our personal and corporate worship. I will make suggestions for activities and each person should respond from their own perspective. Example:

Weekday Evening Meditation Service (in person in the sanctuary)

- 1 How likely are you to participate?
- 2 Would you classify this as personal or corporate worship?

Answers would vary, of course, but an example would be 1. Not likely and 2. Corporate, or maybe personal.

So, without following the format of question-and-answer that I would have to use, I'll just list possible activities and you can think through what your answers would be.

Weekday Evening Meditation Service (online led by Pastor Leigh or Guest Meditation Leader)

Weekly Devotional Service (Online; Led by Pastor Leigh)

Outdoor Church – Once a month have worship service (separate and different from Sunday Service) at Forest Center Trail, Camp Burton, Pt. Robinson or points beyond.

Have prayer partners dedicating prayer and worship time separately but meeting (by phone, Zoom or in person) weekly to share thoughts and inspiration.

Body Prayer – Wednesday Morning devotional with basic yoga following various passages from the Book of Psalms. Led by Leigh.

Praise singing or "sing along" around campfire some evening other than outreach First Friday fire and s'mores.

"Praise Singing Sunday" where our regular service features this kind of music once a month or once a quarter.

Vigils on holy occasions.

These are only a few ideas. I would appreciate hearing especially about your personal worship time.

Purposeful Service Team Areas of Responsibility

Scholarships, Mary's Place partnership, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

Interfaith Council to Prevent Homelessness is again serving meals. Our IFCH representative, Brownie Carver, reports that beginning on September 26th, meals will be served Monday-Friday at the Methodist church. The meals will be takeout using to-go boxes, prepared by volunteers with coordinator Toni preparing Friday's food. VPC will continue to host the fourth Monday and Tuesday. The volunteers will prepare enough food for two evenings. Since this is an easier meal plan, only one or two people will be needed.

At the September 20th meeting, Session approved Purposeful Service Committee's request that the \$1,000 budgeted for Mental Health programs in 2022 be reallocated as a \$1,000 contribution to the Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation. Funds needed for mental health programs and other uses are available in the Memorial Fund if required this year. We hope to have the Mental Health Forum in 2023.

It's always fun to see the kids in their costumes and chat with their parents, so I encourage you to join us!


