## A Message from Pastor Leigh

#### Dear Ones of VPC,

One of the realities of growing up on the East Coast is that you're led to think about NYC marking time for the whole country. The news comes on at 6:00 PM and it's live, not recorded for later or not "a special West Coast edition of...". New Year's is likely the biggest misleading of all. It's 2023 in the United States when the ball drops in Time's Square-- or at least that's what I thought when I was little.

One of my takeaways from that misunderstanding is the widening of my lens. When I moved to Seattle, I realized what I clearly understood in theory, that the country has several time zones and NYC doesn't set time for everyone. While that sounds like a simple realization, it's given me some insight. I bring a certain perspective, a lens, to my life and my understanding of it.

When we come together as a community, we come with a lot of different lenses. Some of us are steeped in the church, we grew up in the church, it's never hurt us or caused us to push away too much. Some of us grew up in the church, left the church and then returned. Some in our community had different experiences. Given all the many realities of life, the many lenses, it's safe to say that there isn't a "right" way to do things. But I do think there's a God's way.

God welcomes all people. God makes space and forgives and seeks to care for all people. God doesn't harm. God loves unconditionally.

#### Worship Survey Update

The VPC Worship Surveys are about 75% returned. A 75% response rate is generally considered outstanding, but for our small community I hesitate to draw conclusions with that many members and friends unaccounted for. However, there are some common threads in certain areas that I believe are representative of VPC as a whole:

- Pastor Leigh's sermons were almost unanimously mentioned as a key worship element, with resonant messages.
- Almost everyone agreed having the hybrid Zoom/in person capability was a great feature of our Sunday worship services now. Whether people were ill, traveling or having company it is valuable to have the option to Zoom.
- Music is a very important part of the worship for our members.
- A majority of our members maintain some sort of personal daily devotional.
- There seems to be the correct number of offerings either in person or on Zoom for worship (timewise) but maybe the content or focus could be tweaked a bit.
- Over half of respondents were in favor of some kind of outdoor service in appropriate weather although there was some concern of how to be inclusive and inadvertently be in a location that was not accessible to all.
- There is an interesting desire go to nature (and by example or deduction away from other people) to find spiritual experiences or connection to God.

These are just a few of summary thoughts from an initial look at the survey. Pastor Leigh and the Worship Committee will use your responses to help plan a program for next year. A complete review of the Worship Survey will be contained in the annual report coming out in January.

# **Clerk's Corner**

Session held its regular monthly meeting December 20<sup>th</sup> at Elizabeth Loveness's home. While Session met in an upstairs room, spouses decorated Liz's Christmas tree downstairs. Following the meeting, all dined together. As Barb Huff will be leaving Session at the end of this year, the dinner was planned to honor her service in a special way.

Finance Elder Jim Lilje provided electronic statements of cash on hand and year-to-date vs budget as of November 30, and presented the 2023 budget for adoption. Session approved the budget for 2023, including the revised terms of call authorized by the congregation at a Special Congregational meeting on December 11<sup>th</sup>. At that meeting the Congregation also elected Bob Spangler and Al Ross-Weston to the Elder Class of 2025 and Caran-Marie Weston Dunbar and Larry Commeree to the Deacon class of 2024.

Session set the date of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation and Corporation as January 29,2023. The business of that meeting will be to discuss Annual Reports and elect the 2023 Nominating Committee. Annual reports will be transmitted electronically, and paper copies will be available in the church lobby during the week before the meeting.

Corporate Registration has been filed with the Secretary of States' Office for 2023. Session was provided with an electronic copy of the membership roll for review. Membership declined from 44 to 40 members in 2023, but a group of new members is anticipated in the Spring.

Hummingbird Marketing Services has been hired and is in the process of switching the VPC website over to a new Internet Host by mid-January.

Session approved a motion from the purposeful service committee detailing that the scholarship sponsored by VPC through the Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation be awarded to a student going into nursing, preferably focusing on senior care with an interest in mental health and hospice training. Community service in some aspect of senior care would be of special interest.

Sessions' final action of the meeting was to approve a motion to contract with Lee Van Valkenburg for up to \$5,000 to prepare and install a concrete patio in the play yard.

More details of all mission activities are listed in each committee's section of this newsletter.

The next regular session meeting will be at VPC on Tuesday, January 17<sup>th</sup> at 4:30 PM.

# Purposeful Service Team Areas of Responsibility

#### Scholarships, Mary's Place partnership, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

In December IFCH began serving the daily meals at VPC rather than the Methodist Church. Hot meals prepared by IFCH volunteers are served daily on a take-out basis from 5:00 to 5:30 pm Monday through Thursday. The Friday meal is a sack meal prepared by IFCH staff. We're pleased that our facility is used for this purpose, especially during cold weather. Warm clothing and blankets are also available at this time during the winter months. VPC's representative to IFCH is Brownie Carver.

On December 3 we collected a carload of plastic bags, Styrofoam and plastic packing materials in the VPC parking lot. Brownie took them to the island-wide event the next day. We will continue to have this collection every other month.

Three Purposeful Service committee members met to discuss the proposed criteria for the Vashon Community Foundation Scholarship that will be awarded in 2023. We will have more information about this in the future.

Mary's Place staff expressed appreciation for VPC's decision to donate the Christmas Eve offering to them. The receipts were \$700.

The 2023 VPC budget includes \$8,000 in donations to Mission Partners. We will highlight in 2023 newsletter articles the organizations that receive these funds. We can make these donations through the General Fund only with the generosity of VPC members and friends.

# **Building and Grounds**

Steve Radic, a local plumber, came and inspected the kitchen plumbing on Dec 7th and is pricing a grease trap. The vinyl tiled flooring near the sink shows signs of water damage and should be replaced. His recommendation is to have the floor tiles removed and replaced with waterproof flooring before installing the trap. Kitchen cabinet doors under the sink will also need to be removed for visibility and inspection of the trap.

The Second Saturday work party on December 10<sup>th</sup> was cancelled due to all the other Christmas activities.

We suffered a few winter-related problems in December but managed to keep the building warm and inviting. In fact, the building was open to the public as a warming spot during the cold spell while office volunteers were available. On Thursday the 22<sup>nd</sup> the furnace in the new building stopped working just before the Christmas Eve Service and reception. We strategically placed electric heaters around the social hall and the reception was a big hit. After Christmas I was able to restore the furnace with some manipulating of the thermostat. However, as I went into the crawlspace to troubleshoot the furnace problem, I discovered that the area's sump pump was not working. A replacement of the same size and configuration was found in the hardware store and switching out the old with the new was fairly simple. By the time the furnace was working, the crawlspace was only muddy instead of under water.

Session approved hiring a contractor to prepare and install a concrete patio in the courtyard playground. It will be under the gazebo erected by Creative Preschool and extend another 10 feet or so beyond that towards the playground equipment. We envision it as an outdoor meeting space or classroom during warmer weather.

Speaking of warmer weather, Beverly and I've got plans to find some warmer weather south of here on a couple of weekends in January. The church will need someone to check up on the thermostats and sump pumps, maybe spread salt on the stairs or shovel a little snow. If you are interested in helping, please contact me at 206-354-8917 and I'll show you where the winter supplies are stored and what to check on.
