# A Message from Pastor Leigh



Dear Ones of VPC,

At our May Theology Pub, we discussed experiences with the Holy Spirit. Have you had one? Would you name experiences you've had in that language? Is it hard to explain or talk about? Or do you just wonder about the Spirit?

The Spirit part of the Trinity is often hard to explain. As I've shared before, when I read the book, The Shack, I was taken by the image of the Holy Spirit carrying a vial to collect our tears. "She loves to collect tears," the author writes.

Another image that sticks with me is from Romans 8 where the apostle reminds us that the Spirit "intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words." That's of great comfort to me when I'm praying for others especially. As a human being, I don't always have the words and the Spirit groans for me at those moments. It's raw and deep and real.

Pentecost, this season we are now entering, is another experience with the Holy Spirit but it's focus is less individual and more corporate. The Spirit came over the whole assembly, they spoke in languages they hadn't known before, and they spread the Word of God exponentially after that experience.

While attending the scholarship awards ceremony at Vashon High School, I heard languages that were new to me, languages about compassion being expressed in new ways. I heard young people speak about a care for the planet that was not part of my vocabulary when I was their age. I heard the expressions of the hearts of young adults that honestly give me hope for our future.

As a congregation, I believe we have that same ability to listen to the Spirit's leadership and hear and learn in new ways. The Spirit has not changed, God's intention for the world is still to live in harmony with God and one another.

The Good News of Jesus' life is still as relevant and important as ever and we are those now gathered together. Will we allow the Spirit to ignite us to listen? To speak? To spread the Word of God?

Pentecost is not just something that happened long ago, but something into which we are invited today. It gives me chills to think of what God might call from us, what God might want from us. Are you open to it? Will you embrace it? Those are the questions of this season. The Spirit of God is at work in the world, that's a given! How we respond is the real work of being the church today.

As the Spirit blows through our gatherings, I pray we jump on board with excitement, looking toward the unknown future with the known God. The best is yet to come!

## **VCP Building Supports our Island Community**

There's a lot going on at VPC that might not have caught your eye. Our building is used by a growing number of groups and organizations. Some are Mission Partners, others are friends, some are tenants and others just want to get together. All are welcome.

As a charitable nonprofit organization, we cannot make the spaces available to "for profit" organizations or individuals. We also stay away from political organizations. We do, however, try to extend hospitality to all. A recent check of our building use calendar identified three nonprofit schools, three Scouting groups, the Vashon Chorale and Opera company, the Vashon Healthcare District, the IFCH meals program, the Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation, and nine addiction support groups. That's a total of 20 groups requesting scheduled meeting space in addition to our Session and Deacons. We also recently had the pleasure of hosting two baby showers!

It sometimes gets hectic coordinating all requests, but it's wonderful knowing that we are making this resource available to so many people in need. Please contact the church office at 206-463-2010 if you would like to plan an event on site.

## Scholarships, Mary's Place partnership, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

The review teams have completed the review of applicants for the VPC scholarships and have selected the candidates to receive the awards. For the Heindsmann Scholarship two applicants were selected: Taegan Kicinski, who is studying for a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing at Pacific Lutheran University, and Landon Summers, who will enroll at Carnegie Mellon University in a Master of Science degree in Public Policy and Management. Each will receive \$1,800 (sent directly to the schools). The Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation scholarship of \$1,500 was awarded to graduating VHS senior Bea Church. Bea plans to get a degree in counseling or psychology and become a therapist, preferably for troubled teens. We plan to present the scholarships in person in June.

We will collect plastic bags, Styrofoam, plastic mailer envelopes, foam food trays etc in the VPC parking lot on Saturday, June 3 from 10:00 to 11:30 am. A committee member will then take the collection to the island-wide event on Sunday. Help us keep this non-degradable material out of the landfill!

June 4 is Food Bank Sunday. We last received 261 pounds of food items, and hope to continue at this generous level of support. Canned tuna, peanut butter, any type of pasta, and chicken or vegetable broth are always appreciated. There is also a need for pet food. For donations of bulk pet food volunteers from VIPP will break down and repackage for individual distribution.

Plans are underway for the festival parking and chairs program in July. We need volunteers to help in areas that both do and do not require physical labor. More information will be in the e-news and the July newsletter. Contact me if you would like to help.

## Worship

We had a worship meeting late in April to plan for the coming months. We will have Communion on Pentecost Sunday as well as our regular first Sunday of each month.

- 1. Prayer cards will continue to be used. Claudia will print and replace each week.
- 2. Leigh will compose a Zoom Etiquette page to be shown at the beginning of each service.
- 3. Claudia will print signage and place in/on the cabinet holding the Communion cups. It will detail the cleaning process to reassure all that the Communion service items are ready to use.
- 4. We decided as a congregation that we are not ready to resume Communion by intinction at this time.

#### Discussion

In looking at the placement of the Doxology (or other musical expression of praise) in the service we see that our order of worship is somewhat different than what is standard at other churches. That is, the offertory and offering come before the sermon at VPC whereas the offering usually comes after the sermon. Our current order leaves a pause between two prayers led by the lay leader. Some leaders have solved this by combining the two prayers. The smooth transition of this time is dependent on how well the lay leader manages the situation. Both ways of ordering the service were discussed. There were strengths and weaknesses given for both ways. In June, we will be looking at three choices. 1) whether we want to return to the more standard order of worship with the offering after the sermon, 2) identify a third hymn with a praise theme to replace the doxology keeping the offering before the sermon as we have it now, or 3) reinsert a traditional doxology with the order as we have it now. This might sounds confusing and and seemingly a minor detail, but this is the thought given to all parts of the service to create the most cohesive, inspirational experience for the worshiper. Let us hear from you if you have an opinion. Bev is going to research alternative hymns of praise.

#### **New Sermon Series**

Leigh is starting a five-week sermon series on the book of Hebrews the Sunday after Pentecost. We will also have combined worship with Vashon Island Community Church on Strawberry Festival weekend.

#### **Outdoor Worship?**

I came upon this poem again after all these years. When I was in college it was always on my bulletin board in my dorm room. Even now, it still causes me to stop and think.



# **Building and Grounds**

Lee Van Valkenburg brought his grading machine to the church on May 6 and regraded the parking lot as arranged when he filled potholes in April. Lee is also one of the contractors bidding on installing a concrete patio in the courtyard between the sanctuary and social hall.

During our Second Saturday work party on May 13 Barb Huff and I used string trimmers to trim around the edges of the parking lot and between the shrubs bordering the lot. Barb also cleaned up a large amount of trash and junk left in the northeast corner of the lot. Once the shrubs stop blooming, we need to trim them to keep them manageable.

Claudia Ross-Weston fabricated a curtain to finish off the area beneath the kitchen sink and hide the grease trap. Vinal plank flooring has been ordered for the kitchen and back hallway surrounding it and vinyl sheeting for the two bathrooms near the church office. Installation will begin in the middle of June.

Prior to installation we will have to remove the existing vinal tiles in the hallway and bathrooms. To make sure we remove all the tiles and trim, and touch up the flower beds, let's plan for work parties on both June 3 and June 10 from 9:00-noon. If you can make either or both days, your help will be greatly appreciated. Carpe Diem volunteers will be there June 3 and 4, Spring cleaning the classrooms, so it will be an opportunity to meet some parents and children.

Session approved a resolution to permit the serving of alcoholic beverages at events held on VPC premises providing that:

- The event has been approved by both the Building and Grounds coordinator and the respective Elder
- The event is intended primarily for adult guests, with limited presence of children, and
- At least one VPC leadership representative (Pastor, Elder, past Elder) will attend and ensure
- that the guests are served responsibly.

Co-Op Preschool Toddlers and Infants class will have their last session on Wednesday June 7.

Carpe Diem will end this term on June 15, with early dismissal at noon.
