A Message from Pastor Leigh

Dear Ones of VPC,

Outside of my office window is a large butterfly bush filled with big purple blossoms. It's been filled with bumblebees darting from flower to flower lately. While drinking the nectar for nourishment, they gather pollen on their limbs and take it to the next flower.

Because plants are rooted in one place, they rely on pollinators to move the pollen. These little pollen gatherers are essential to flowers and budding trees, all sorts of fruits and vegetables. It's a reminder that creation has an intentional design, encouraging life.

As I watch the bumblebees drinking from the bush, I wonder how I scatter life around. Do I allow goodness to stick to me in such a way that I leave it wherever I go? For human beings this takes a bit more intentional work. In Philippians 4, Paul writes about the kinds of things with which we should fill our minds.

He talks about things that are good, trustworthy, lovely, excellent, and praiseworthy. Feed your brain with these things, he encourages us.

It makes me wonder if that's not the key to pollinating the world with goodness and kindness. It's far too easy to fall into scrolling on our smart phone through news feeds that are rarely too encouraging, or mindlessly sitting in front of the television. To encourage growth in the world around us we must be conscious of what we carry with us, what "sticks" to us. And like bees we must stick our heads into that which feeds the spirit and nourishes the whole being.

What gives you life? What feeds your spirit? What nourishes you with abundance? Spending some time with those questions, I suspect, might be an important part of this work of the kingdom of God right here on Earth. My prayer is that we are all healthy, good pollinators in this world.

Planning Committee Update

In recent months, you might have observed a gradual positive change in our building's appearance. Earlier this year, the VPC Planning Committee (Diana Lilje, Jacq Skeffington, Liz Loveness, Claudia Ross-Weston, Barb Huff, Nancy Tucker) identified several needed repairs or upgrades to our property. They prioritized these suggestions in deciding how to proceed.

You have probably noticed our first items: the old, dented Sanctuary doors have been replaced with doors that let the light shine through. The kitchen floor (whose tiles were lifting) and the hallway floor have been replaced with new luxury vinyl planks. The two bathrooms in the newer section of the church have had their vinyl tile squares replaced with sheet vinyl. The East Room now has electrical outlets, and two additional microphones have been purchased for use in the Sanctuary. Outdoors, a concrete patio has been laid, giving us a useable outdoor courtyard. And as this article is being typed, the bathrooms are getting a new coat of paint.

More building upgrades are planned and expected to be completed by yearend: These include:

- Electrical outlets in the Social and Great Halls, as well as the church exterior
- Installation of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in the East Room
- A drinking fountain/water bottle refill station to be installed in the Great Hall
- A permanent cabinet to house the Sanctuary audio-visual equipment
- Purchase of a marker for Kate Smith's gravesite

Thanks to your generosity, combined with that of past members and specific bequests, we are making these deferred and much-needed improvements to our building and property.

Building and Grounds

It's been a very busy month for maintenance and repairs around the church, and there are still many opportunities to help. New flooring has been installed in the kitchen, hallways, and bathrooms. We removed the baseboard trim to facilitate the installation, and we will have to replace it.

Robin Lewis is scheduled to clean the sanctuary carpet on August 8 and the Social Hall, Great Hall, and East Room carpets on August 14. For him to do that, the pews will need to be moved into the East Room and Narthex after worship August 6. Then the pews will need to be moved back into the sanctuary by Saturday the 12th so that the East Room and Social Hall carpets can be cleaned August 14. We'll need only a few volunteers for those moves and we have dollies and a hand truck to make the job much easier.

In between moving the pews, we're planning to paint the Social Hall and Great Hall August 8 -11!

If you prefer gardening, Lee Van Valkenburg completed construction of the courtyard patio on July 21. Nancy van Roessel, Kathy O'Laughlin, and Claudia Ross-Weston have diligently thinned, transplanted, and mulched the flowerbeds surrounding the sanctuary and extended the bed alongside the patio. They will certainly appreciate helping hands even if only to water plants in this heat.

In other news:

While preparing preschool classrooms in the basement, we discovered badly deteriorated concrete walls which had been covered up with cardboard bulletin board panels. These panels have been removed and the concrete is being wire-brushed, patched, and refinished.

Jim Hyde has now rerouted the wiring for the camera in the back of the Sanctuary, installed additional outlets in the East Room, Social Hall, and Youth Room, and is installing locking exterior outlets in the front yard and courtyard.

If you have any desire to help or any suggestions for continuing improvements, please let me know.

Worship

We held a brief worship meeting in July. There was consensus that our worship services have been inspiring and informative. They receive very positive feedback on our congregational survey. A majority of the congregation also approves of names being spoken during prayer, coupled with the prayer cards for more articulation of the prayer requests.

Incorporating new musicians and music into the service also gets wide approval. Thanks to Marsha Morse and Beverly Skeffington for the time they spend encouraging and helping talented musicians from our church family to integrate into our service. The VPC congregation also likes to host other churches and groups from the community. We enjoyed having Vashon Island Community Church visit during Strawberry Festival. We are looking forward to planning an ecumenical wilderness service with the Vashon Lutheran church and to hosting the group from Mary's Place in Seattle this coming September. In the spirit of "love your neighbor," we aim to continuously widen our awareness and improve our openness to all.

A goal our committee had concerns the worship and youth areas for which I am responsible. We want to plan and participate in one outdoor (wilderness) worship experience this summer. Ideas include sites right here on Vashon. The Camp Burton site we use for Easter sunrise service Is one possibility. A stopping place along the Center Forest Trail is another. The service might be as simple as music, possibly meditation, or sharing, or just a time of soaking up the wonders of God's creation. I have hesitated because it's been a busy summer. But I will call a meeting **August 7, at 7 :00 PM.** I invite those committee members who would enjoy creating a service of this kind. It is intended to supplement, not replace, the Sunday morning services, which will continue as usual. The "wilderness" service can be scheduled any time of the week. Hopefully we will include some of our youth in this worship adventure! We have only a month, possibly two, left of Pacific Northwest good weather. So let's try for the end of August as our target date for this wilderness service.

Once a month we are going to create a "Stone Bouquet" for the altar. It is based on the idea of the stone soup fable. Everyone will be invited to bring a flower or two from their yards. This bouquet will be assembled Sunday morning before the service by our own very talented flower arranger, Héré Thieme. We debuted our Stone Bouquet on July 23. It was truly gorgeous!

Purposeful Service Team

Areas of Responsibility Scholarships, Mary's Place partnership, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

August 6 is Food Bank Sunday. Bring your items to the worship service or to the church office. Canned tuna, peanut butter, any type of pasta, and chicken or vegetable broth are always appreciated. In addition to food items, people may bring personal hygiene items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste. There is also a need for pet food. For donations of bulk pet food, VIPP volunteers will break down and repackage for individual distribution.

The Strawberry Festival seats, and parking program was successful. We were able to supply seating for 120 people, 97 of whom had made seat reservations in advance. The remaining 23 non-reserved chairs were filled by walkups, including five wheelchair slots. We also received 41 parking reservations. Donations amounted to \$1,003. A great group of helpers made this event possible, and comments from the community were very favorable.

With the approval of Session, we have invited the staff of Mary's Place to bring a group to Vashon on September 3 for a joint worship service, followed by an outdoor (weather permitting) lunch on the new VPC patio. We do not yet have confirmation of the date, and will place more information in the e-news.

The bi-monthly collection of plastics and Styrofoam at VPC will be **August 12** from 10:00 - 11:30 AM, not the usual first weekend of the month. Hard plastics and soiled plastic bags are no longer accepted, and we will be required to sort accepted items into six categories:

- Clean white Styrofoam
- Colored Styrofoam
- Styrofoam packing peanuts sealed in a bag
- Polythylene foam
- Plastic film, such as bubble wrap, grocery bags, mailing envelopes and zip-lock bags
- Multi-layer plastic such as chip bags, food bags, clean soil and bark bags and produce netting
